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Blurring the lines between the private and public sectors

Addressing the multiple intersecting disease burdens in Nigeria requires an equal balance between prevention and care.

Nigeria holds great potential but faces challenges with being the most populous country in Africa with a 40% poverty rate. The inequitable distribution of income, wealth and, therefore, health plays a vital role in solving the nation's complex challenges.

The Adopt-A-Healthcare-Facility Programme (ADHFP) is a multi-impact initiative that aims to provide world-class Primary Healthcare Centre (PHC) in each of the 774 LGAs of Nigeria, with the current focus on Delta, Bauchi, Edo, Rivers and Kano.

A total of 91 PHCs of the targeted 774 have been achieved, and to reach our commitment to supporting the NPHCDA in making primary healthcare accessible to all Nigerians.
